This fun and informative lecture shows where Barbara started her quilting journey—in 1993 with a sampler quilt (she asks the audience to NOT look close at the hand quilting, corners, matching (?) seams, binding, etc.!). From there, it progresses through to Barbara's two-sided art quilts and her most recent work to date. A selection of Barbara's quilts will be available to view, and slides of many more will be shown. The audience is encouraged to participate with questions and comments.

Quilting Workshops:

Heron Moon—Thread Painting

*Saturday, February 25th —10am-6pm; 1875 University Ave**

Intended for the quilter who is comfortable with machine stitching but would like to take it to the next level. By completing the head and upper torso of the Great Blue Heron - made entirely by machine quilting - students will practice the stitches Barbara uses to add depth and dimension to her fiber art pieces. Topics to be covered include what thread to use and when, the order of quilting, using a hoop, outlining, machine needles, and transferring images to fabric. We will also discuss how to make the piece two-sided.



Current Wave—Machine Appliqué

*Sunday, February 26th 10am-6pm; 1875 University Ave**

This contemporary fiber art piece can be done in all different color combinations. Lots of students interpret the wave in reds, oranges and yellows - creating a stunning fire! However you interpret it, this award-winning quilt is a showstopper. Using an easy freezer paper machine appliqué method, this complex-looking design is actually quite easy to make! The pattern includes a full-sized master drawing and step-by-step instructions to complete a quilt that measures 42" square when completed. Workshop participants will learn quilting options to make the piece even more dynamic. In addition, we will discuss options for the reverse side of the quilt.

* The lecture and classes will be held at 1875 University Ave— the Northern Threads building. The classroom entrance is on the left side of the building.
