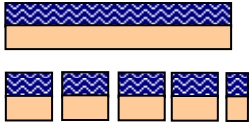


February 2010 BOM
Scrappy Buckeye Beauty 12" finished block

- One 2"x 9" strip from four different medium or dark prints (Civil War reproduction style or calico)
- One 3 7/8" square from each of the four medium or dark prints
- One 2"x 9" strip from four different beige/tan tone-on-tone prints
- One 3 7/8" square from each of the four beige/tan tone-on tone prints



Pair up a medium/dark print strip with a beige/tan t-o-t print strip and sew together lengthwise. Press seams open. Square up one end, cut strip into four 2" segments--there will be a little waste piece left.

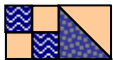


Sew two segments together to form a 4-patch unit. Make two 4-patch units. Press seams open.

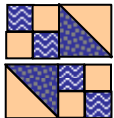


Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the beige/tan print square (it matches the fabric used in the 4-patch units above). Pair it with a different medium/dark fabric square than used in the 4-patch unit above.

With right sides together sew 1/4" on each side of the drawn line. Cut apart on the drawn line and press seams toward dark fabric. There will be two half-squares.

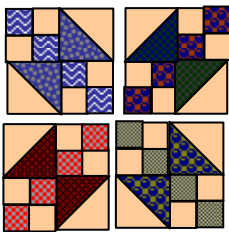


Sew a half-square and a 4-patch together as show on left. Repeat with the remaining half-square and 4-patch.



Rotate one set 180 degrees and sew together as shown.

Repeat with the other medium/dark prints and the other beige/tan t-o-t prints. You will have 4 units.



Stitch units together into block. Block should measure 12 1/2" x 12 1/2" and will finish to a 12" x 12" block.
