

Shades of Anasazi—2 blocks

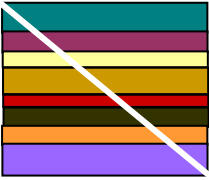

8" x 8" finished block

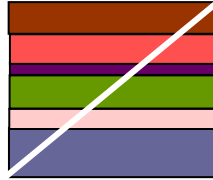
Earth/desert/sand-toned strips of batik fabrics 10" long and between 1 5/8" wide and 2 3/8" wide. This would include colors such as: taupe, beige, peach, cream, brown, tan, golden yellow, rusty-orange, olive/grayed green, dusky purple, gray, cinnamon, deep rose.

Cut 12 to 14 strips of batik fabrics in widths varying from 1 5/8" wide to 2 3/8" wide. You will need 6 or 7 strips for each strip set. There are two strip sets. Vary fabrics and widths as much as possible, using only one or two of the narrowest widths per each strip set.

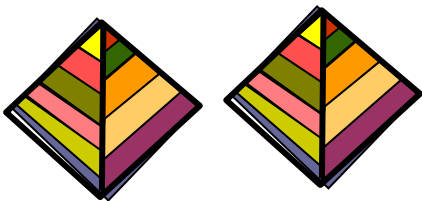
Square up each strip set to 9" x 9" square.

With right sides up:

Cut the first square (A) on the diagonal from left top to right bottom.

Cut the second square (B) on the diagonal from bottom left to top right.

Take one section of A and one section of B and sew together along long diagonal using a scant 1/4" seam allowance. Be careful not to stretch the block. Press seam open and trim block to 8 1/2" x 8 1/2" square. Repeat for the remaining A section and B section. You will have 2 blocks.
