Meeting was opened at 6:35pm at the Mary Siah Recreation Center.

1. Renewal of Domain Server Contract - We currently pay \$20 a month for web hosting only (not maintenance). The domain name and website is set to expire on 10/08/09. A request was made to renew the name and site. Amey and Dana looked at the situation last year. No bids were acceptable. It was decided to renew for 1 year. Dana will look into cost of other local hosting possibilities. Melissa suggested a local server for non-profits.
2. Survey questions - Dana reviewed. Ellen added an additional question.

Tanana Fair Final Report

A big thank-you to everyone who helped with the fair this year. It was a big success, with the perfect number of entries (85) to fill our racks. There were some very beautiful quilts this year, and I'm hoping you will start working on an entry for next year so we can continue to make the quilt show "the best thing at the fair," as so many people say. Don't forget that we have QUILTALASKA next summer, and the dates overlap, so you will have to make two pieces. As a reward for your efforts, I give you the recipe for those rhubarb cookies I brought to a meeting (and to the judges' lunch). Enjoy! I am off on my travels, so I will see you in the spring. -- Kathy Dubbs

Rhubarb cookies

2 cups rhubarb, finely chopped	2 cups all purpose flour	1/2 tsp ground cinnamon
1/2 cup white sugar	2 tsp baking powder	1/2 cup milk
1/2 cup butter, softened	1/8 tsp salt	1/2 cup raisins
1 cup brown sugar	1 tsp ground allspice	1 cup pecans or walnuts, chopped
1 egg		

Toss rhubarb and white sugar in glass or plastic bowl and let it sit overnight. Drain off about 1/4 cup of liquid; cook rhubarb and remaining liquid in small saucepan over medium heat until just tender but still holding shape (do not cook too long!). Drain and set aside. Preheat oven to 350. Grease two cookie sheets. In large mixing bowl, cream together butter and brown sugar. Add egg and beat until smooth. In medium-sized bowl, sift together flour, baking powder, salt, allspice, and cinnamon. Alternately add the flour mixture and the milk to the creamed mixture, beating well after each addition. Stir in the rhubarb, raisins, and nuts. Drop by the teaspoonful onto baking sheets. Bake about 12 minutes or until lightly browned. Place on wire racks to cool. ENJOY!!

Don't miss this chance to learn how to make these great bags! Easy and fun, they make great gifts. Make them any size you want! For this class, you will make two bags: One for you and one to donate to the Guild Booth at the UWA Bazaar.

Supplies to bring:

1. Sewing machine with walking foot and zipper foot.
2. Coordinating fabrics - may be strips or fat quarters or just your scrap pile. Fabric strips should be 3/4" to 2" wide, by 16" long.
3. Zipper (at least 14" or longer) for each bag you want to make (may match or contrast with your fabric). NO metal, large plastic or invisible zippers.
4. Usual sewing supplies (pins, scissors, favorite cutting tools, etc.).
5. Bag insides (thermolam or thin batting or batting scraps). Approx 9" x 16" for each bag.
6. Material for bag linings and pockets. Light colors are best. Approx a fat quarter for each bag.
7. Large square ruler - 15" is better than 12" but either will work.
