

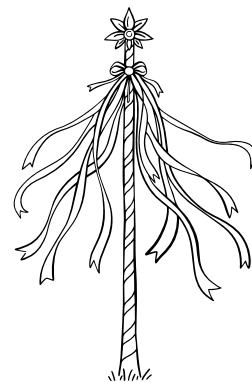

## Quilt Alaska

The biennial show, organized by Cabin Fever Quilters Guild and Fairbanks Arts Association, is open to CFQG members and residents of Interior Alaska, Doyon Region. Held at Bear Gallery in Pioneer Park, it features quilts of any size and wearable art garments. Each person may submit either one entry, or both a garment and a quilt. If you are unsure whether your item will qualify for the show, please ask. For this exhibit, a “QUILT” consists of three layers—a designed top, center batting, and back—held together by stitched patterns or designs. This description pertains to both quilts and wearable art. We support all quilting styles: traditional, contemporary, and modern.

### **Important Requirements for All Entries:**

- All quilts must have Velcro (hook side) securely attached to the top for hanging. Very large quilts must also have Velcro on the bottom corners.

All quilts and garments must stay on display for the full show; early pickup is not permitted.

You can sell your work; however, FAA will retain a 35% commission.

### **Quilt Alaska 2026 - Important Dates**

Friday, May 1 – Friday, June 5 Submission Period

Submit your entry online at the Cabin Fever Quilters' Guild website, <https://www.cfqgalaska.org/>

You will be asked to provide a description of your work. This will appear next to your artwork as your artist's statement. Please provide notable details about yourself or your quilt. Submission of a photograph is no longer necessary.

### **Sunday, June 28 Intake at Bear Gallery**

Drop off your quilt at Bear Gallery. (We will ask for volunteers to assist with intake and for the show set-up during the week.)

### **Friday, July 3, 5:00 pm – 7:00 pm First Friday at Bear Gallery**

We provide refreshments and will also request volunteers for the reception.

### **Thursday, July 16, 6:00 pm Artist Talk with Gayle Hazen**

### **The quilt show will run from Friday, July 3 through Saturday, August 1**

**Sunday, August 2** Take down at Bear Gallery – You will pick up your quilt at the gallery. (We will ask for volunteers for this day also.)

### Crockpot Mac & Cheese

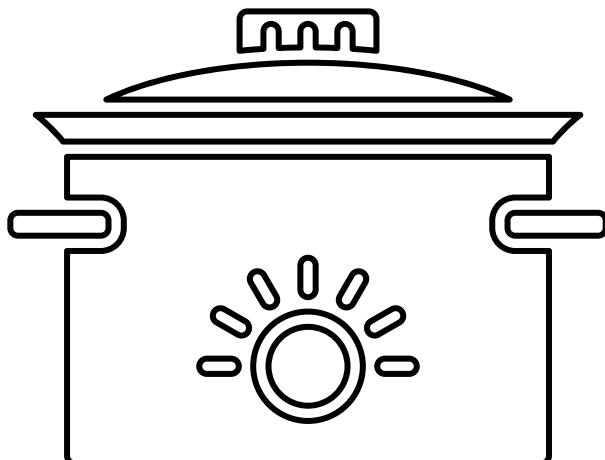
Recipe from Karen Kiss & Tricia  
Brouillard

- 1 - 7oz. Box of macaroni, cooked
- 1 - 12oz. Can evaporated milk
- 3 eggs beaten
- 1/3 cup butter, melted
- Salt & pepper, to taste
- 3 to 4 cups grated cheddar cheese,  
divided
- ( 1.5 to 2 cups sharp cheddar and 1.5  
to 2 cups medium cheddar)

Mix macaroni, milk, eggs, butter. Add salt and pepper and 2-3 cups cheese.

Stir well and pour into a 5 Qt. crockpot.  
Sprinkle it with the remaining cheese.

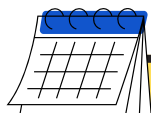

### Small Quilt Auction Guidelines:

**Size Range:** No smaller than 32" total of all sides; No larger than 100" total of all sides

Consider shapes other than squares or rectangles, i.e. oval, triangle, etc.

### Fabric:

Preprinted fabric giving the false impression of pieced work is not what we are looking for. Use your creativity when using your printed fabric especially if you are fussy cutting or using parts of the fabric in appliqué.

### Quilting:

Whole cloth quilting, hand quilting, machine quilting as well as tying are all acceptable.

### Quality of Work:

Care must be taken to present QUALITY workmanship. The committee head will assure that all entries are well done and labeled by the quiltmaker.

## Mystery Quilt Block 4

### Mystery Quilt, Block 4

#### Materials

- 9x22" piece (fat eighth) each of light print, dark print, and medium print No. 1
- Scrap of medium print No. 2

Finished block: 9" square

Quantities are for 100% cotton fabrics.

Measurements include  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowances. Sew with right sides together unless otherwise stated.

#### Cut Fabrics

Cut pieces in the following order.

##### From light print, cut:

- 2- $3\frac{1}{2}$ " squares, cutting each diagonally twice in an X for 8 triangles total
- 4-2" squares
- 8- $1\frac{1}{2}$ x $2\frac{3}{4}$ " rectangles
- 16- $1\frac{1}{2}$ " squares

##### From dark print, cut:

- 4- $1\frac{1}{2}$ x $2\frac{3}{4}$ " rectangles
- 4-2" squares
- 8- $1\frac{1}{2}$ " squares

##### From medium print No. 1, cut

- 2- $3\frac{1}{2}$ " squares, cutting each diagonally twice in an X for 8 triangles total
- 4- $1\frac{1}{2}$ " squares

##### From medium print No. 2, cut

- 1- $2\frac{3}{4}$ " square

#### Assemble Corner Units

1. Use a pencil or a white dressmaker's pencil to mark a diagonal line on wrong side of each light print 2" square and each dark print  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " square.
2. Layer a marked light print square atop a dark print 2" square. Sew together with two seams, stitching  $\frac{1}{4}$ " on each side of drawn line (Diagram 1). Cut apart on drawn line to make two triangle units. Press each triangle unit open, pressing seam toward dark print, to

make two triangle-squares. Each triangle-square should be  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " square including seam allowances. Repeat to make eight triangle-squares total.

3. Align a marked dark print  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " square with one end of a light print  $1\frac{1}{2}$ x $2\frac{3}{4}$ " rectangle (Diagram 2; note direction of marked line). Sew on marked line. Trim excess fabric, leaving  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance. Press open attached triangle, pressing seam toward dark print to make a rectangle unit. The unit should still be  $1\frac{1}{2}$ x $2\frac{3}{4}$ " including seam allowances. Repeat to make four rectangle units total.
4. Repeat Step 3 with marked line of dark print square running in opposite direction to make a reversed rectangle unit (Diagram 3). Repeat to make four reversed rectangle units total.
5. Referring to Diagram 4, sew together two light print  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " squares and two triangle-squares in pairs. Press seams toward squares. Join pairs to make a square unit. The unit should be  $2\frac{3}{4}$ " square including seam allowances. Repeat to make four square units total.
6. Referring to Diagram 5, sew



together the following pieces in pairs: square unit and rectangle unit and reversed rectangle unit and medium print  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " square. Press seams open. Join pairs to make a corner unit. The unit should be  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " square including seam allowances. Repeat to make four corner units total.

#### Assemble Hourglass and Flying Geese Units

1. Referring to Diagram 6, join two light print triangles and two medium print triangles in pairs. Press seams toward medium print. Join pairs to make an hourglass unit; press seam in one direction. The hourglass unit should be  $2\frac{3}{4}$ " square including seam allowances.
2. Use a pencil to mark a diagonal line on wrong sides of remaining light print  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.
3. Align a marked light print square with one end of a dark print  $1\frac{1}{2}$ x $2\frac{3}{4}$ " rectangle (Diagram 7; note direction of marked line). Sew on marked line. Trim excess fabric, leaving  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance. Press open attached triangle, pressing seam toward dark print. In same manner, add a second marked light print square to other end of rectangle to make a Flying Geese unit. The unit should be  $2\frac{3}{4}$ x $1\frac{1}{2}$ " including seam allowances. Repeat to make four Flying Geese units total.

# Mystery Quilt Block 4

## Mystery Quilt, Block 4

### Assemble Block

1. Referring to Diagram 8, sew a Flying Geese unit to a light print edge of an hourglass unit to make a star point unit. Press seam open. Repeat to make four star point units total.
2. Referring to Block Assembly Diagram, lay out corner units, star point units, and medium print  $2\frac{3}{4}$ " square in three rows. Sew together pieces in each row. Press seams away from corner units. Join rows to make a block. Press seams in one direction. The block should be  $9\frac{1}{2}$ " square including seam allowances.

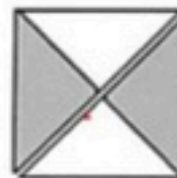

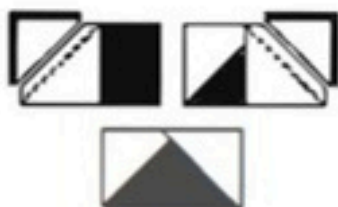
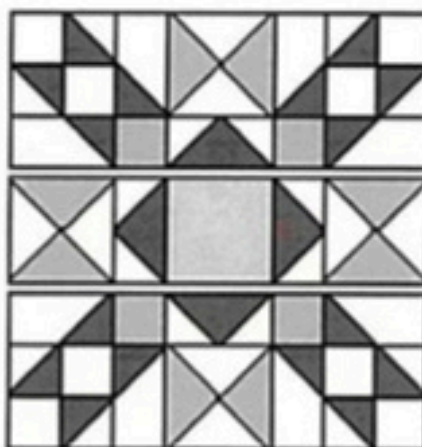

## Mystery Quilt Block 5

### Mystery Quilt, Block 5

#### Materials

Finished block: 9" square

Quantities are for 100% cotton fabrics.

Measurements include  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowances. Sew with right sides together unless otherwise stated.

#### Cut Fabrics

Cut pieces in the following order.

##### From dark print, cut:

- 2–3" squares, cutting each in half diagonally for 4 small triangles total

##### From medium print No. 1, cut:

- 1–3½" square

##### From medium print No. 2, cut:

- 4–2¾" squares
- 8–2" squares

##### From light print, cut:

- 2–4" squares, cutting each in half diagonally for 4 large triangles total
- 4–2×3½" rectangles
- 4–2¾" squares
- 4–2" squares

#### Assemble Square-in-a-Square Units

1. Sew dark print small triangles to opposite edges of medium print 3½" square (Diagram 1). Press seams toward triangles. Add remaining dark print small triangles to remaining edges to make a small Square-in-a-Square unit. Press seams toward triangles. The unit should be 4¾" square including seam allowances.
2. Referring to Diagram 2, sew light print large triangles to opposite edges of small Square-in-a-Square unit. Press seams toward light print triangles. Join remaining light print large triangles to remaining edges to make a large Square-in-a-Square unit. Press seams toward light print triangles. Trim unit to 6½" square including seam allowances.



#### Assemble Flying Geese Units

1. Use a pencil to mark a diagonal line on wrong side of each light print 2¾" square and medium print 2" square.
2. Layer a marked light print 2¾" square atop a medium print 2¾" square. Sew together with two seams, stitching  $\frac{1}{4}$ " on each side of drawn line (Diagram 3). Cut pair apart on drawn line to make two triangle units. Press each triangle unit open, pressing seam away from light print, to make two triangle-squares. Each should be 2" square including seam allowances. Repeat to make eight triangle-squares total.
3. Align a marked medium print 2" square with one end of a light print 2×3½" rectangle (Diagram 4; note direction of marked line). Sew on marked line. Trim excess fabric, leaving  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance. Press open attached triangle, pressing seam toward medium print. In same manner, add a second marked medium print 2" square to opposite end of rectangle to make a Flying Geese unit. The unit should be 3½×2" including seam allowances. Repeat to make four Flying Geese units total.

## Mystery Quilt, Block 5

### Assemble Block

Referring to Diagram 5, lay out four light print 2" squares, eight triangle-squares, four Flying Geese units, and large Square-in-a-Square unit in sections. Sew together pieces on each side of large Square-in-a-Square unit. Press seams in one direction. Then join pieces in three horizontal rows. Press seams toward light print squares and Square-in-a-Square unit. Join rows to make a block. Press seams toward middle row. The block should be 9½" square including seam allowances.

### **Fabric and Cutting for One Block**

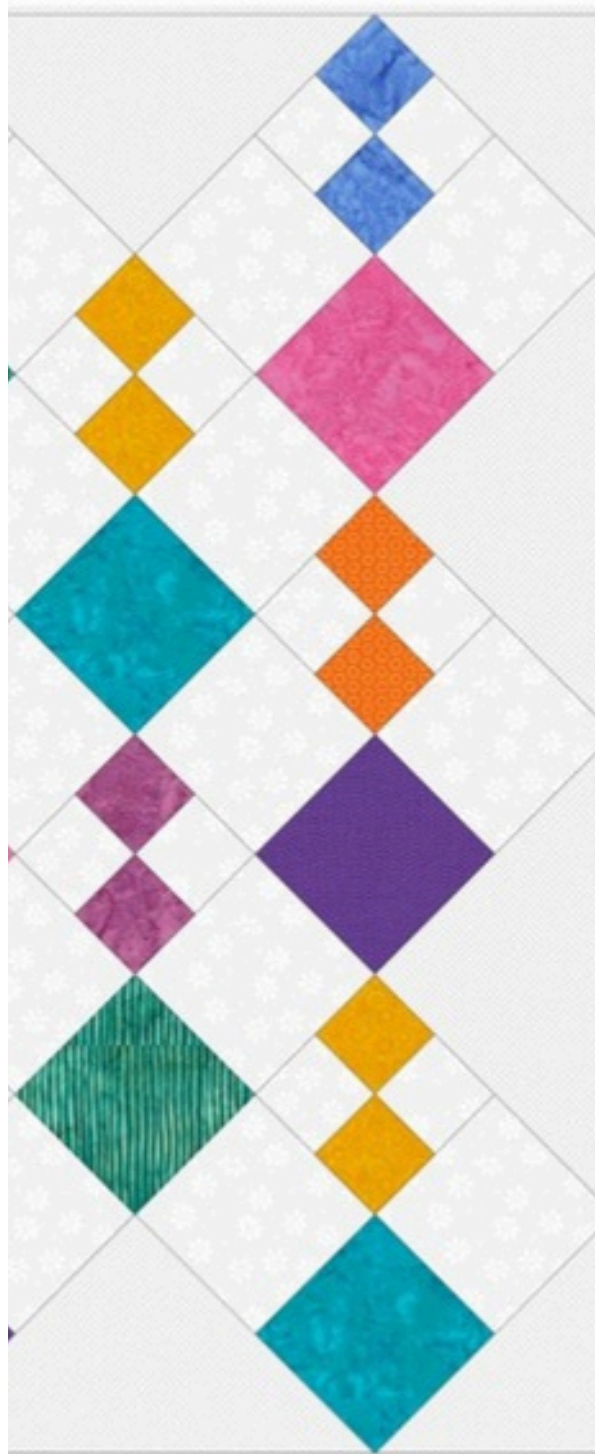
Use jewel tone batik fabrics for the “beads”. Use very light batiks for the background.

Sew your 4-patch together first, then piece as shown to make your block. Press to the lighter fabric.
