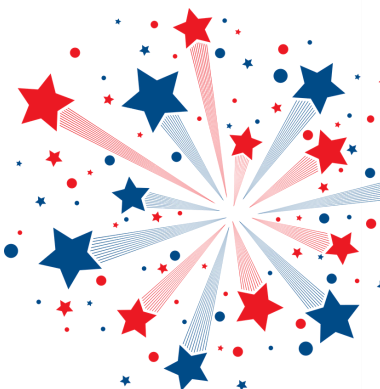

Secret Pals: Check table in back Raffle Quilt 2026 - "Forever Winter" Quilt is displayed. At Morris Thompson Center. Pat Fox has tickets. Remember that books stay together. Please make sure all stubs for tickets sold have name and phone number.

Sew Flurries: Mary Olson Elks Club will charge \$750 for the week if we donate a queen-sized quilt but will not allow machines or equipment on the lift. Corlis Taylor moved, Dorothy Stella seconded that we go ahead with contract, motion failed.

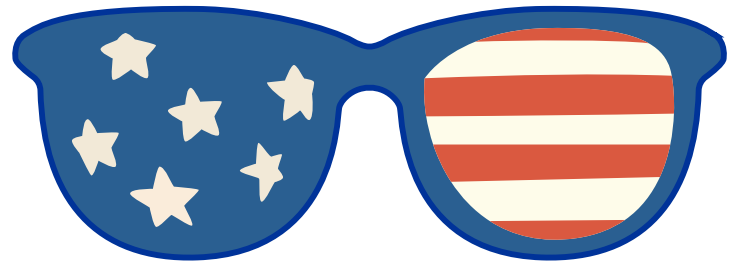

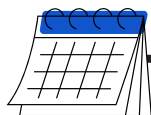

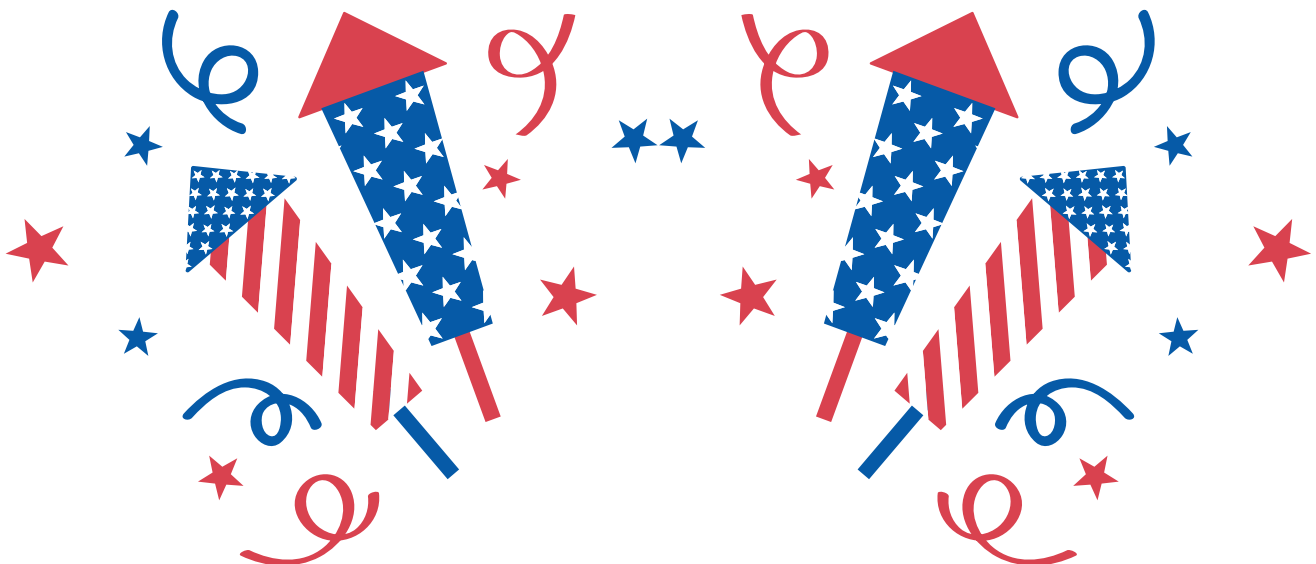
Volunteers Needed!!

Sewing Day at Faith Baptist July 21st

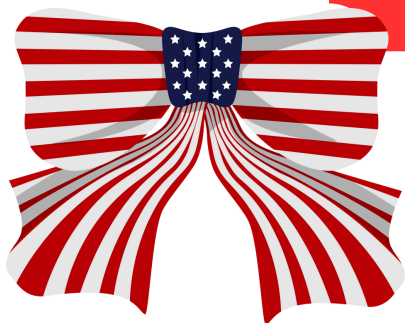
Come sew with us on July 21st from noon until 6:30 PM, before our General Membership Meeting!

Small Quilt Auction Guidelines:

Size Range: No smaller than 32" total of all sides; No larger than 100" total of all sides

Consider shapes other than squares or rectangles, i.e. oval, triangle, etc.

Fabric:

Preprinted fabric giving the false impression of pieced work is not what we are looking for. Use your creativity when using your printed fabric especially if you are fussy cutting or using parts of the fabric in appliqué.

Quilting:

Whole cloth quilting, hand quilting, machine quilting as well as tying are all acceptable.

Quality of Work:

Care must be taken to present QUALITY workmanship. The committee head will assure that all entries are well done and labeled by the quiltmaker.

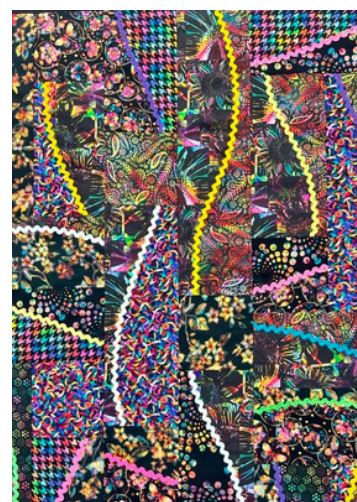

Eureka Supply List

By Maple Island Quilts

Eureka is a gentle curve-seam pieced quilt. Pattern calls for the maker to freehand cut the curves on each pair. I have supplied two freezer-paper templates to use to cut the curves hopefully to make it easier for newbie curved-seam piecers.

By the pattern there are 2 variations:

Quilt A uses plain fabric squares for the separator squares; Quilt B uses pieces of the curved-seamed strips for the separator squares.

I made 4 samples that are larger than the pattern with different borders.

Quilt A 36" x 48"

3/8 yard of 8 fabrics

3/8 yard of inner border

1/2 yard outer border

5/8 yard binding or use leftovers



Quilt B 36" x 48"

1/4 yard of 10 fabrics

1/4 yard border light fabric

1/2 yard border dark fabric

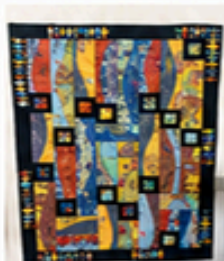
Australian print 42" x 57"

1/2 yard of 10 fabrics

3/8 yard block border fabric

1/2 yard inner & outer borders yard

1 yard background flying geese & square borders



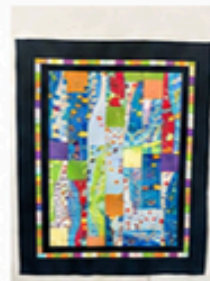
Kid's prints 46" x 54.5"

1.25 yards of each 8-10 directional fabrics

5/8 yard of 8-10 non-directional fabrics

6 fat-quarters of different fabrics for border and inner squares

1.24 yards inner & outer borders

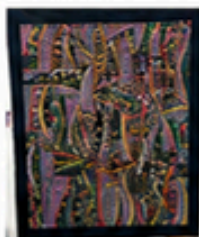


Black & Bright 62" x 72"

3/4 yards each of 10-12 fabrics

1 yard border

20-23 yards rick rack



Pink fabric 62" 68"

2/3 yard interior squares

1/4 yard of 12 fabrics

1/3 yard inner border

1.25 yards outer border



45 mm rotary cutter with a new blade

6"-8" square ruler

Straight pins

Small diameter glue stick (Sewline, Bohin, Sew Easy, Acorn Easy Press Pen, etc)

Quilt in a Day 4-at-a-time flying geese ruler for 3" x 1.5" flying geese (if doing the flying geese border)

Any curved ruler you have that you want to try.

6"-8.5" x 24" rectangle ruler

neutral/matching thread

scissors

Mystery Quilt Block 8

Mystery Quilt, Block 8

Materials

- 9x22" piece (*fat eighth*) each of light print, dark print, and medium print

Finished block: 9" square

Measurements include $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowances. Sew with right sides together unless otherwise stated.

• Cut Fabrics

Cut pieces in the following order.

From light print, cut:

- 4— $2\frac{3}{4}$ " squares
- 4— $1\frac{3}{8}\times 2\frac{3}{4}$ " rectangles
- 28— $1\frac{3}{8}$ " squares

From dark print, cut:

- 4— $1\frac{3}{8}\times 5$ " rectangles
- 4— $1\frac{3}{8}\times 2\frac{3}{4}$ " rectangles
- 8— $1\frac{3}{8}$ " squares

From medium print, cut:

- 4— $1\frac{3}{8}$ " squares
- 1— $2\frac{1}{2}$ " square

Mark Squares

Use a pencil or a white dressmaker's pencil to mark a diagonal line on wrong side of 20 light print $1\frac{3}{8}$ " squares and all dark print $1\frac{3}{8}$ " squares.

Assemble Block Center

1. Align marked light print squares with opposite corners of medium print $2\frac{1}{2}$ " square (Diagram 1; note direction of marked lines). Sew on drawn lines, trim excess, leaving $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowances. Press open attached triangles.
2. Align marked light print squares with remaining corners of medium print square (Diagram 2; again note direction of marked lines). Stitch, trim, and press as before to make a Square-in-a-Square unit. The unit should be $2\frac{3}{4}$ " square including seam allowances.

3. Align a marked light print square with one end of a dark print $1\frac{3}{8}\times 2\frac{3}{4}$ " rectangle (Diagram 3; note direction of marked line). Sew on marked line. Trim excess fabric, leaving $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance. Press open attached triangle, pressing seam away from light print. In same manner, add a second marked light print square to other end of rectangle to make a dark Flying Geese unit. The unit should be $2\frac{3}{4}\times 1\frac{3}{8}$ " including seam allowances. Repeat to make four dark Flying Geese units total.

4. Referring to Diagram 4, lay out the medium print $1\frac{3}{8}$ " squares, dark Flying Geese units, and Square-in-a-Square unit in three rows. Sew together pieces in each row. Press seams away from Flying Geese units. Join rows to make block center. Press seams in one direction. The block center should be 5" square including seam allowances.

Assemble Side Units

1. Using marked dark print squares and light print $1\frac{3}{8}\times 2\frac{3}{4}$ " rectangles, repeat Assemble Block Center, Step 3, to make four light Flying Geese units (Diagram 5).
2. Align a marked light print square with one end of a dark print $1\frac{3}{8}\times 5$ " rectangle (Diagram 6; note direction of marked line). Sew on marked line. Trim excess fabric, leaving $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance. Press open attached triangle, pressing seam toward dark print. In same manner, add a second marked light print square to other end of rectangle to make a rectangle unit. The unit should be $5\times 1\frac{3}{8}$ " including seam allowance. Repeat to make four rectangle units total.



3. Referring to Diagram 7, sew together two remaining light print $1\frac{3}{8}$ " squares, one light Flying Geese unit and one rectangle unit in two rows. Press seams in one direction. Join rows to make a side unit. Press seam in one direction. The side unit should be $5\times 2\frac{3}{4}$ " including seam allowances. Repeat to make four side units total.

Assemble Block

Referring to Block Assembly Diagram, lay out the light print $2\frac{3}{4}$ " squares, side units, and block center in three rows. Sew together pieces in each row. Press seams away from side units. Join rows to make a block. Press seams in one direction. The block should be $9\frac{1}{2}$ " square including seam allowances.

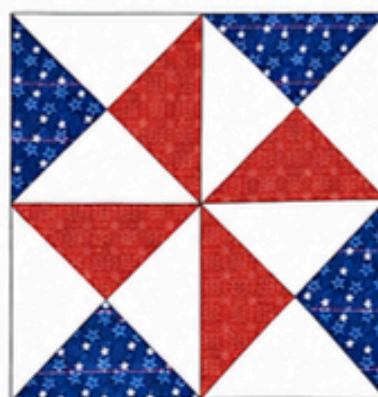
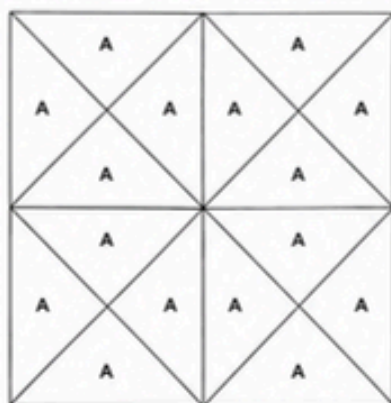
BLOCK ASSEMBLY DIAGRAM

Summer Fun with Red, White and Blue!

Fabric and Cutting for One Block

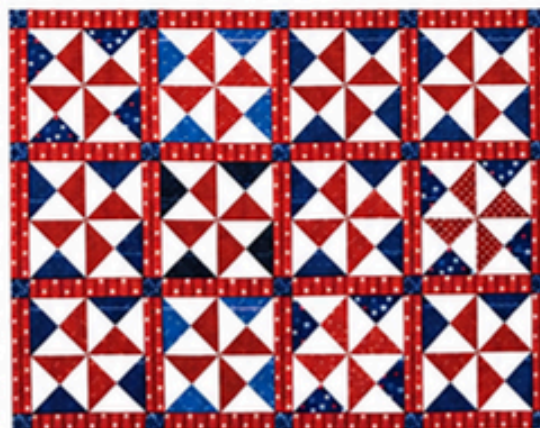
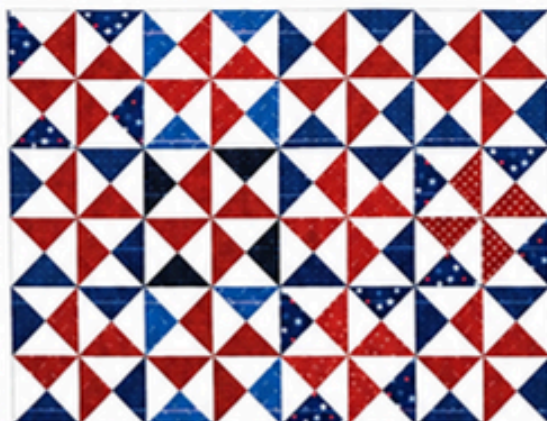
Use red prints for the pinwheels, blue prints for the other quarter square triangles, and white-on-white for the background.

A – All pieces are the same size. To make this simple block, you will use quarter square triangles. Cut one blue square, one red square, and two white squares, each measuring 4 1/2 inches, then subcut them into quarter square triangles.

Sewing

Sew the quarter square triangles together as shown to make four hourglass units, pressing toward the darker fabric. Because you will be sewing on bias edges, stitch carefully. Trim each hourglass unit to 3 1/2 inches, then sew the four units together as shown.

You can also find many helpful online tutorials for making quarter square triangles and hourglass units.



Finished size is 6 inches, 6 1/2 inches unfinished.
